Interpreting Your ILTS Score Report

Your ILTS score report provides your results and a description of your performance for the test taken on the test date.

Status

If you received a scaled total test score of 240 or above, you will receive a "Pass" status. If you received a scaled total test score below 240, you will receive a "Did not pass" status.

Scaled Total Test Score

Your scaled total test score is reported on a scale from 100 to 300. Your score is based on your performance on the constructed-response assignments.

Subarea Score

Your subarea scores are reported on a scale from 100 to 300 and provide feedback on your performance by subarea. This descriptive-only information may help you assess your strengths and weaknesses.

Constructed-Response Information

Scorers judge the overall effectiveness of each response using a score scale and a set of performance characteristics. Refer to your score report backer and the study guide for more information.

Performance Graph

The performance graph illustrates each subarea score on a scale from 100 to 300.

Passing Score

To pass this test, you must obtain a scaled total test score of 240 or above.


